Update from Andy Colwell, Deputy Director of Estates and Facilities

As we are now heading into the colder months, a lot of work has been progressing on reviewing our plans for winter. The Estates Team have confirmed arrangements for adverse weather events, such as snow clearing and gritting and the Grounds Team are busy with the final works before the cold weather is here. We have also been working with the Resilience Team to review our response to this summer's record-breaking hot temperatures and refining plans for next year.

Meet Ivan - Our first four-legged employee!

Chris Lowe works for HIF in our talented Grounds
Team.

A few years ago, Chris was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes. Unfortunately, Chris has experienced difficulties with knowing when his levels drop and he needs treatment.



A Medical Detection dog is trained to detect early signs of different illnesses, ranging from neurological conditions, to different types of cancer, even COVID 19.

A Medical Alert Assistance dog is trained to detect even the smallest odour change, which can allow an individual to seek treatment before experiencing an emergency situation.

Ivan is three and a half years old and has previously been a Vision Support dog, before he began training with Chris. Ivan had to complete months of specialist training with a Medical Detection Dogs charity in Milton Keynes, which involved Chris providing varying samples of his every day smell, which Ivan then came to recognise.

With diabetes, there is an initial generic smell common to all but, following his intensive training, Ivan is now able to recognise Chris' unique scent and changes, even in the middle of a busy hospital!

This training allows him to warn Chris when his acetone levels are changing and to remind him to manage his condition. Ivan will fix a stern look on Chris, which escalates into a nudge, then a very loud bark, if Chris does not pay attention! Ivan has been with Chris since July and is rewarded with treats when he alerts Chris. He even has his own canopy bed to relax in whilst Chris is working hard!



If you see Chris and Ivan around, do say hello, Ivan is very friendly and calm. Just make sure your feet are clean as that is where he likes to start to sniff!

Please do not feed Ivan however, it is a requirement of his training that he only accepts treats from Chris - he would be an even more pampered pooch otherwise! Don't worry, Ivan is well rewarded and well looked after.

Congratulations to the Sterile Services Department for maintaining GREEN status for their IHEEM JAG audit in September. It is a fantastic outcome, as this is the highest level that can be achieved.

This decontamination review is designed to assess the suitability of decontamination facilities as part of a JAG accreditation assessment or annual review and will determine if they meet the requirements of the NHS and independent UK healthcare sector. The audit process of flexible endoscope decontamination requires knowledge of how the department operates, as well as expertise in decontamination and the review is part of an ongoing quality control survey. This should be reviewed in conjunction with the annual infection prevention quality improvement audit.

Thank you to Stuart Kelly


We recently held a beautiful tea party at Herriots in celebration of Stuart Kelly's retirement.










HIF Reading Group


